Pre-registration training programme

We currently offer 2 pre-registration training placements well supported by experienced pre-registration tutors.

As one of our trainee pharmacists, you will be a highly valued member of a dynamic forward-thinking pharmacy team. You will follow a comprehensive training plan that may be tailored to reflect your learning needs and areas of clinical interest.

Rotations

You will undertake core clinical and dispensary rotations and also work in other areas, including medicines information and the aseptic unit.

During your rotations, you will work alongside experienced clinical staff in patient-facing settings from the outset of your training.

You will also complete a 2-week cross-sector placement in community pharmacy.

Learning support

You will meet with your personal tutor on a weekly basis; they will monitor your progress, as well as support you and your learning needs.

You will also participate in the UEA preregistration pharmacist training programme, to interact with other trainee pharmacists in the East of England and enhance your learning.

Our trainees participate in the UEA Training Programme

The programme is provided to 75 hospital trainees undertaking their placements in the East of England.



Trainees attend a series of residential study blocks which provide group-based interactive learning facilitated by expert practitioners. The focus is on application of knowledge and skills in practice. Learning is supported by a virtual learning environment on UEA Blackboard.
