Further follow up

Once your treatment is complete, you will be invited to attend an end of treatment appointment with the breast care nurses to discuss how you are getting on and commence your personalised care follow-up programme.

If appropriate, you will have mammograms every year for five years. An appointment for this will be sent to you. Please contact the breast care nurses if you do not receive this.

If you are over the age of 47 you do not need to attend your National Breast Screening appointments, as we will organise your annual screening mammograms over the next five years. If you receive an invitation to the National Breast Screening, please inform your screening centre that you are having yearly symptomatic mammograms for five years. After this time, you will automatically revert to the three-yearly National Breast Screening Programme.

When you get home, you may find that you or those close to you have unanswered question or concerns. If so please telephone the Breast Care Nurses (your key workers) between 9.00am and 4.00pm Monday to Friday on 01284 713281 or you may prefer to discuss your concerns with your GP.
