What to expect

An Exercise Tolerance Test (ETT) is used to assess your heart's response to exercise. This includes your heart rate and blood pressure.

The test is used to generate stress on your heart during exercise, and identifies any abnormalities that are not apparent at rest. This test takes about 30 to 40 minutes.

You will be asked to remove your clothing above the waist and ECG electrodes will be placed on your chest to record your heart rate and rhythm. A gown will be provided.

During the test you will be asked to walk on a treadmill. The exercise begins on a relatively easy level and progressively becomes more difficult.

Your ECG and blood pressure are recorded and measured at frequent intervals during and after your test.
