Transcervical Resection of the Endometrium (TCRE): post-operative

To be read in conjunction with Transcervical Resection of Endometrium pre-operative leaflet

Post-operative advice

- You will have been given painkilling and anti-sickness medication as appropriate during the operation.
- Antibiotics will also have been given, to reduce the risk of infection.
- · You will have a small amount of vaginal bleeding.

You will be checked at regular intervals by the nursing staff in recovery and the ward. You will be given further treatment as appropriate before a discharge home.

Post-operative discharge advice

- You will have a small amount of bleeding for a day or so and you will see a brown vaginal discharge for a few weeks. To reduce the risk of infection, please use sanitary towels or panty liners, **not tampons**.
- Do not have sexual intercourse until the discharge has stopped.
- You may have a quick bath / shower after 24 hours, thereafter daily.
- You may experience some lower abdominal discomfort, like a period pain. This
 can be relieved by taking painkillers such as paracetamol, ibuprofen or similar
 pain-relieving medication.

- You have severe pain or fever
- Vaginal bleeding increases to more than what you would consider to be a heavy period
