## Taping of the lower eyelid

Entropion is an uncomfortable condition when the lower eyelid rolls inwards and the lashed rub on the eye.


This leaflet describes a temporary way of making your eye more comfortable whilst awaiting surgery:

- Wash your hands
- Use a piece of 1" wide Transpore or Sellotape, approximately 3 − 4 cm long.
- Apply to the skin of the lower eyelid with one end just beneath the eyelashes.
- Pull down gently before securing the other end to the skin on the cheek. The
  eyelid should be pulled down into its normal position under slight tension.
- If the eye waters, adjust the tension in the tape so the lid is not turned out too far.
- The tape will require changing at least once daily as it loses its tension or comes unstuck.
