Please report any of the following signs and symptoms:

- Vaginal bleeding or discharge
- Unexplained pelvic or abdominal pain
- Abdominal or leg swelling
- Changes in bowel or bladder function, lasting more than 2 weeks and which cannot be explained
- Any lumps, sores or changes in appearance on external genitalia

Please do not wait until your next clinic appointment.

We run the specialist clinic every week and will always be happy to see you at the next session.

How to contact us

You have been given a booklet containing information about your condition. However, when you get home, you may find that you or your relatives have unanswered questions or concerns. If so, the Gynaecology Specialist Nurse is available week days to answer your calls. The specialist nurse is also known as your 'key worker'. They will coordinate your care and provide advice and support to you and your family.

Prescriptions

Patients with cancer DO NOT have to pay prescription charges. In order to make sure you get your prescriptions free of charge you will need to speak to your GP (not your hospital doctor) about how to obtain a valid exemption certificate (form FP92A).
