## What is a specialist frailty therapist?

You have been referred to us for assessment, and we will work in partnership, to learn what is important to you. We want to help you to maintain / increase your confidence and independence, to prevent frailty, and unnecessary admission to hospital.

Our service is centred around you and is provided by occupational therapy and physiotherapy.

#### What our service includes

Together we will improve safety and build resilience, leading to improved quality of life with optimum levels of independence. We will agree a personalised care plan that accommodates your preferences and decisions. We will achieve this by using some of the following interventions:

- Assess your strengths and challenges
- Adapt your environment, and explore equipment including assistive technology (devices to aid a person's ability in everyday life)
- Agree some exercises
- Encourage you to maintain and engage with daily life activities
- Discuss how you can live a healthier life
- Talk about how you can live the life you want to live
- Work alongside your GP, nurses and other healthcare professionals
- Work alongside your family, carers and other services
- Sign-post you to services / groups in your local community
- Empower you to maintain these positive changes and healthy choices
- Enable you to monitor changes in your abilities and information on who to contact if things change
