Smoking cessation support in hospital

The tobacco dependence team visit every patient in the hospital who smokes to provide support, advice, and free Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT).

The steps we will take together are:

- 1. An initial discussion with you about your smoking and the NRT which can be provided to support you during your stay and on discharge.
- 2. Explore and describe the stop smoking services in your community and offer you a referral to your preferred option for continued support and provision of NRT.
- 3. A follow up call with you after discharge to chat about your smoking cessation journey so far and try to answer any questions you have.

The most effective way to stop smoking is with a combination of treatment and behavioral support.

You are three times more likely to quit with this method than unaided (cold turkey).

Nicotine is addictive. Treatments work by easing nicotine withdrawal symptoms through:

- · Providing a smaller dosage of nicotine to help reduce cravings
- Replacing the habit by providing an alternative to smoking at points which you would have had a cigarette e.g. in the morning with a coffee

When you quit smoking, you will have:

- · Better health
- More energy
- More money
- More time
- · Achieved your goal

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Putting you first

Your chance of success is increased by behavioral support provided by a tobacco dependence advisor, who will join you on your journey to provide advice, listen to your concerns and celebrate your achievements.
