West Suffolk Community Local Action Policy for acceptance of referrals for residents in Care Homes

Residents must meet the following criteria to be referred to Community Dietetics

- Referrals with a MUST score of 2 or above AND the resident continues to lose weight after the implementation of food fortification for 4 weeks
- Referrals with a MUST score of 2 or above with a category 2 pressure ulcer or above can be referred to dietetics
- Any residents prescribed oral nutritional supplements not currently being monitored by a dietitian
- Please ensure that all sections of referral form are completed.

ALL referrals must be accompanied with

- A detailed 3-day food and fluid record chart (snapshot taken from 4-week food and fluid record chart) which <u>must</u> show evidence of implementing food first advice. (Example of a food diary in Nutrition Support Action Pack)
- Weight history chart. If no history of weight, please state why e.g. resident recently admitted.

If a referral is received without all the above information the referral will be rejected.
